The Ambassador Society was born—to acknowledge these 32 couples, 29 individuals and six foundations whose level of giving and caring is unparalleled. The name was inspired by Ambassador Walter and Leonore Annenberg, whose invaluable support of Eisenhower Medical Center exemplifies the spirit of philanthropy. Members of the Ambassador Society are honored for capturing the founding vision of Eisenhower Medical Center as a world-class hospital and helping turn that vision into a reality. Through their giving, the Ambassador Society, which currently has more than 90 members, represents the heartfelt generosity, compassion and volunteer service necessary for saving and improving lives at Eisenhower Medical Center.

On Monday, February 4, they were honored at the inaugural dinner at The Vintage Club in Indian Wells. The elegant black tie event, planned by the Ambassador Society Committee, which included Leonore Annenberg as Honorary Chair, featured a special "beam signing" of a 700 pound, 10-foot steel beam—the final steel connection bridging the original hospital and the new state-of-the-art \$212.5 million Annenberg Pavilion. Ambassador Society members signed the beam—a physical manifestation of the significant impact their unparalleled generosity has made on Eisenhower Medical Center.

Ambassador Society members each received a specially designed Ambassador medallion, set on red velvet and framed.

The evening also premiered two new tribute awards: a Humanitarian Award and a Distinguished Fellow Award. Each year, the Humanitarian Award will be given to an Eisenhower Medical Center physician in recognition of outstanding service. Joel Hirschberg, MD was chosen as the first recipient of this special honor, presented by G. Aubrey Serfling, President and Chief Executive Officer. The Distinguished Fellow Award, which will be given annually to a donor who has shown exceptional dedication to Eisenhower, was given by Harry M. Goldstein, Chairman of the Eisenhower Board of Directors, to Stanley Pace, who has played an active leadership role at the Medical Center for more than 10 years.

The recognition wall is part of a dynamic redesign of the hospital entrance façade; construction of this grand entry is scheduled to begin in January 2009.
