

Eisenhower And The Berger Foundation Provide Relief To Haiti

On January 12, 2010, the country of Haiti was hit with a devastating earthquake. It is estimated that the 7.0 magnitude quake left nearly 250,000 people dead and approximately one million Haitians homeless. Eisenhower Emergency Physician Raul Ruiz, MD, MPP, MPH volunteered on the ground in Haiti to provide emergency medical care to the earthquake victims. Impressed by Dr. Ruiz's efforts, The H.N. and Frances C. Berger Foundation asked Eisenhower Medical Center to ensure that the foundation's \$1 million donation for emergency and medical supplies would find effective use in Haiti. Dr. Ruiz facilitated the Berger Foundation's donation to Samaritan's Purse, a non-profit organization that has worked in Haiti for more than 30 years.
